MAX KADE FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

Through the generosity of the Max Kade Foundation, the Department of German Studies is able to provide four \$4,000 scholarships to enable students from Emory University to participate in the 2018 Vienna Summer Program (Two scholarships are for students who will take Intermediate German 201/202 in Vienna, and the other two scholarships for students who will take third-year German 370 A/B in Vienna). Recipients are selected on the basis of (1) financial need, (2) academic merit, and (3) strength of application and recommendation. German majors and minors will receive preference.

For your application to be considered, you must complete the program application through the Study Abroad website by Wednesday, January 17, 2018. Recipients will be notified by Friday, January 26, 2018. The scholarship funds will be disbursed in May to your OPUS account.

2. One (1) letter of recommendation from an Emory faculty member submitted directly to Terez Whatley-White, the department's Academic Administrator, either as an email (twhatle@emory.edu) or in a signed, sealed envelope (Modern Languages Bldg 202A). The letter should address your interest in and suitability for study abroad.
